LAW BEING CHALLENGED:

North Dakota Century Code Chapter 12.1-36.1, a law making it a crime to provide gender affirming care to transgender youth, while permitting the same exact medical care to be provided to youth who are not transgender.

CLAIMS:

- HB 1254, which was signed into law by Governor Doug Burgum and went into effect in April 2023:
- Violates plaintiffs' constitutional right to Equal Protection
 - Violates parents' fundamental right to parent
 - Infringes on plaintiffs' constitutional right to bodily autonomy and self-determination
 - Unconstitutionally Vague
 - Infringes on Dr. Casas' constitutional right to Due Process

PLAINTIFFS ARE ASKING FOR:

Immediate prohibition of enforcement of the law
Declare the law unconstitutional and prohibit the state of North Dakota from enforcing it
